- A noun names a person, place, thing, idea, quality or action. A possessive noun shows ownership by adding an apostrophe, an "s" or both. To make a single noun possessive, simply add an apostrophe and an "s."

POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES:

- Possessive adjectives are used to show ownership.
